We want to help businesses reduce the latter, which in turn helps lessen the former.




Some pollutant risks have decreased over time...

Progress is Being Made

Lead Air Quality, 1980 - 2010

(Based on Annual Maximum 3-Month Average)
National Trend based on 31 Sites



1980 to 2010: 89% decrease in National Average



Exposure Is Not Just From The Air

National Drinking Water Standards - MCLs

- Many have parts per billion (ppb) thresholds
 - Arsenic 10 ppb
 - Atrazine 3 ppb
 - Carbon Tetrachloride 5 ppb
 - Mercury 2 ppb.....

National Priority List Sites

- Sites of national priority for cleanup due to releases of hazardous substances, pollutants, or contaminants.
- Nationally, 1313 sites as of December 24, 2012
- Nebraska has 13, from Ogallala to Omaha
