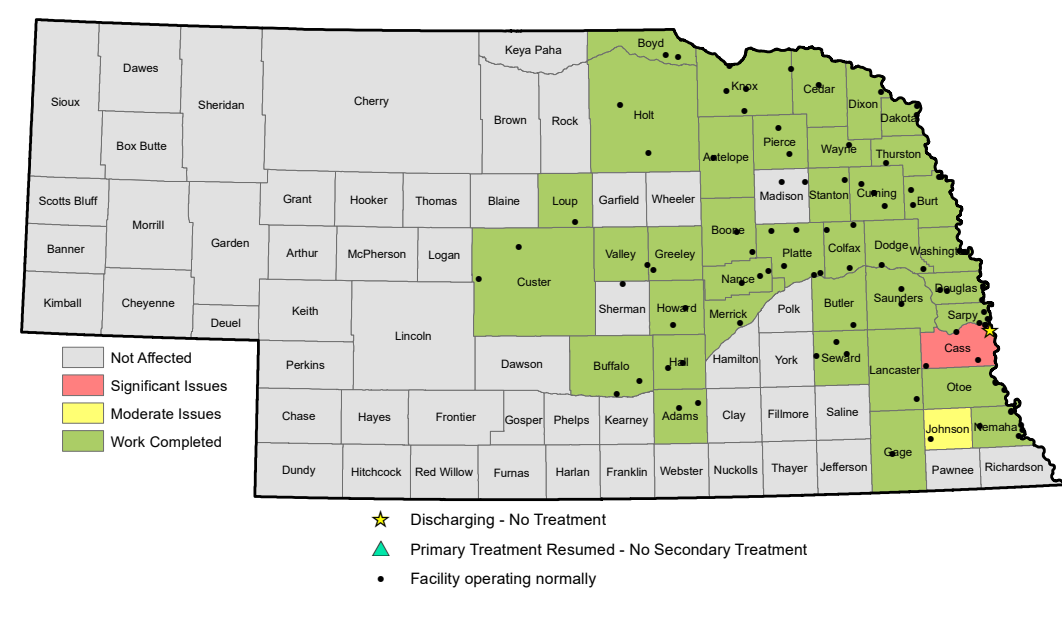
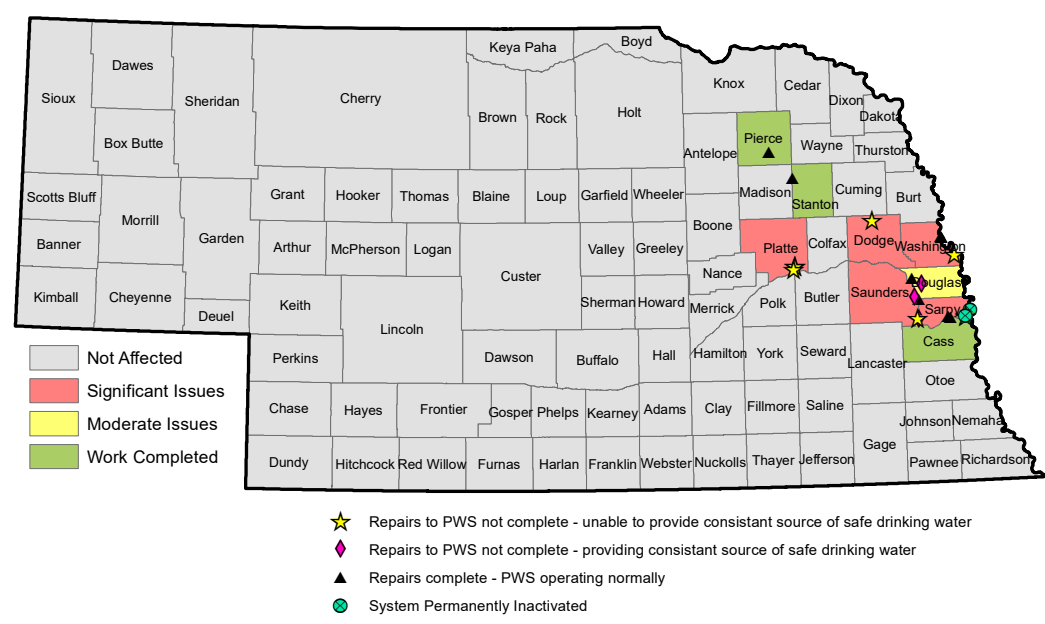
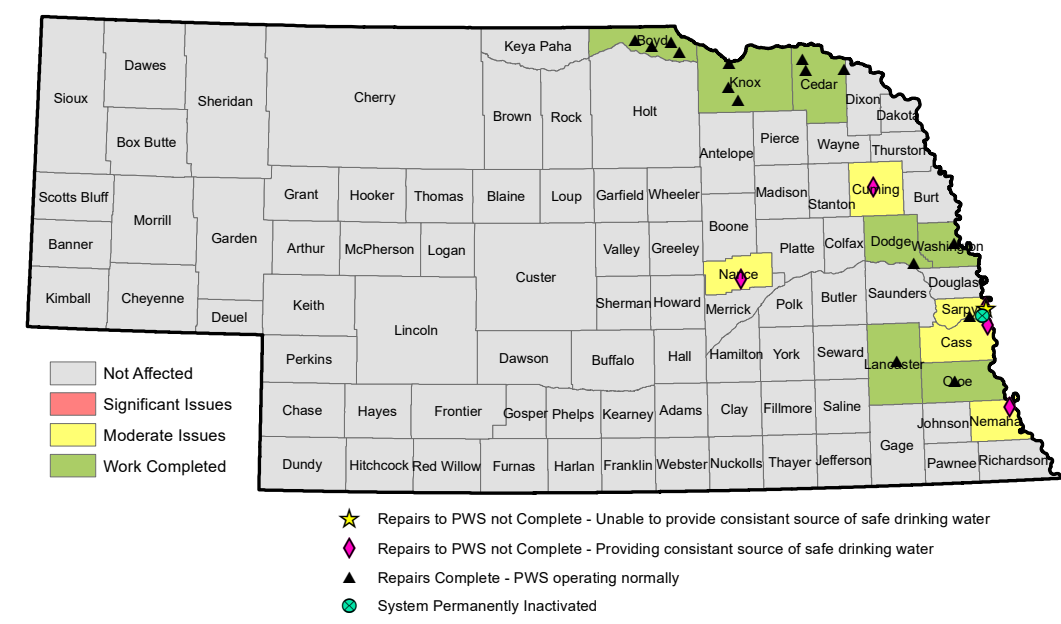

Wastewater Facility Status

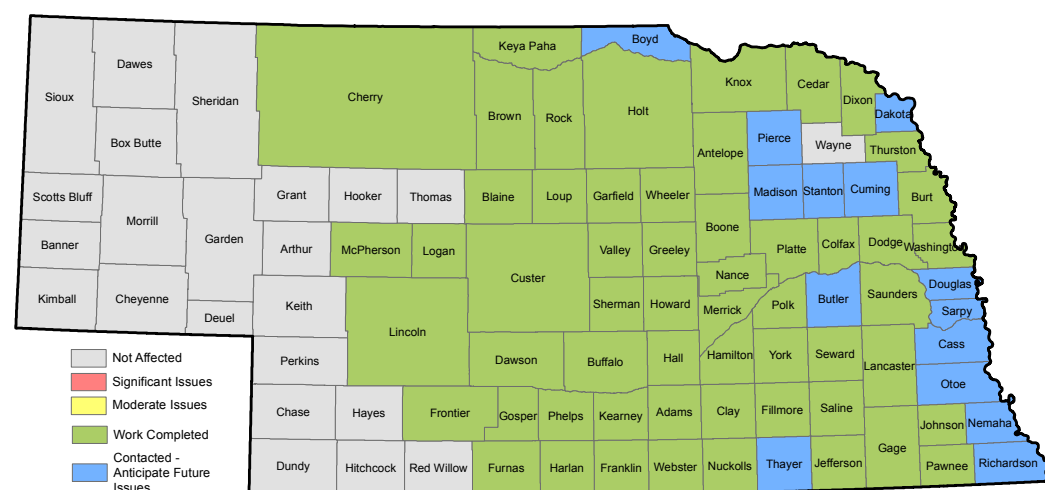
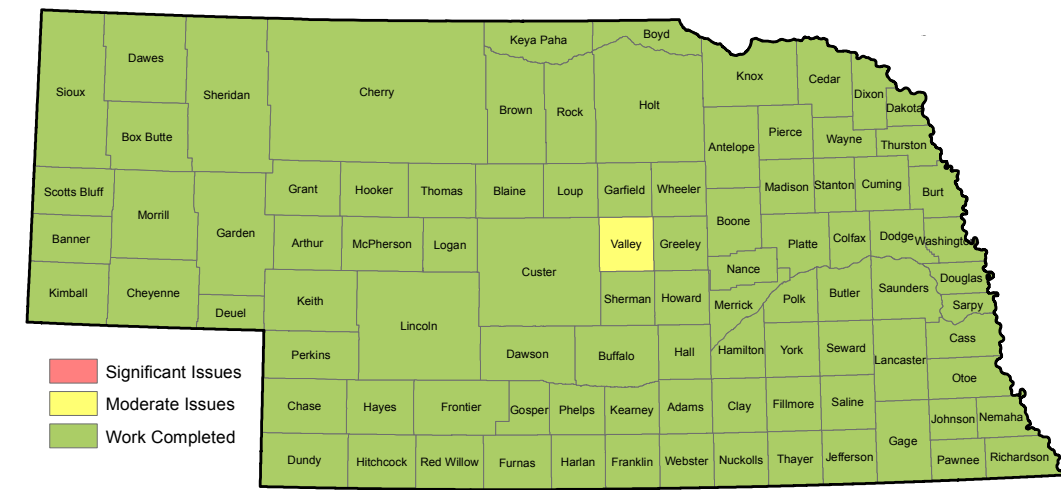


Livestock Facility Status

Objectives:
 • Provide technical assistance to Public Water Systems (PWS) compromised by flooding
 • Coordinate with PWS owners/operators to develop timelines for restoring service

Status:
 • Currently, three community PWS, and seven non-community PWS with primary sources of water still off-line
 • Made state revolving loan funds available to affected communities.

Objectives:
 • Work with a livestock waste control facilities (LWCF) and wastewater treatment facilities

Status:
 • Working with the Plattsmouth WWTF and Crab Orchard's WWTF in their recovery efforts
 • NDEE made state revolving loan funds available to affected communities.

Objective:
 • Administer weatherization and loan programs

Status:
 • Offered the Dollar and Energy Savings Loan at 1% interest for March flooding. As of Aug. 26: 124 loans committed for \$2,572,647.28
 16 loans entered (not yet committed) for \$35,394.48
 35 loans participated for \$427,599.46
 • Initiated the Weatherization Assistance Program for emergency repairs/replacement for HVAC systems. As of Aug. 26: Work completed in five homes
 Work in-progress in two homes
 Three pending applications \$17,527.76 in weatherization assistance.
 • Offered the DESL at 1% interest for the July flooding in the Central Platte and Republican River Basin areas. As of Aug. 26: Two loans committed for \$19,842.27
